The Love Walk Lesson 2 – Cultivating Love

Introduction

- Welcome to BWC's Discipleship Training class on The Love Walk – Lesson 2! This class will help you learn the importance of walking in the Love of God as you continue the journey to heaven.
- In this class we will be discussing:
 - ▣ Showing God's Love
 - ▣ Cultivating the Fruit of the Spirit
 - ▣ Seeking after the Gift of Love
 - ▣ Looking through His Eyes

Showing God's Love

- God is depending on us to show forth His love to the lost and dying. That is our purpose here! It really is all about LOVE.
- People are drawn to a loving God, not an angry God. It is God's love that draws people to Him. It is His goodness and kindness and His GRACE that brings people into the kingdom.
- As we studied last week, the world is a really cold, cruel place. Even families are cold. Why? Because these are the last days and the love of many has waxed cold.
- But God loves everyone and wants to reach them. And He wants to use you and me to do it!

Showing God's Love

- So how do we show God's love to people? There are challenges when trying to love people with the God love. Some people are really tough to love. That's the beauty of Agape love! It really does look beyond what is seen and heard from a person.
- The first thing we have to do to show God's love is to learn about it. We study the characteristics found in the Word of God.
- We should all make a real effort to dig into the Word on our own to discover how to show forth God's love for the lost. How can we love if we don't understand it or relate to it?

Showing God's Love - Jesus

- Part of learning is to watch God love people through Jesus Christ's ministry. Let's look at how Jesus loved people with the love of God.
- Let's go to the Word of God and see what Jesus did to show the love of God to people....and what He is still doing today.
 - ***Matthew 4:24 says "So the report of Him spread throughout all Syria, and they brought Him all who were sick, those afflicted with various diseases and torments, those under the power of demons, and epileptics, and paralyzed people, and He healed them."***
- It takes the God love of people to make yourself available to minister to all who come for help. This scriptures shows that He tirelessly loved people and healed them ALL. They kept coming and coming and He kept healing and healing them. Jesus was totally available.

Showing God's Love - Jesus

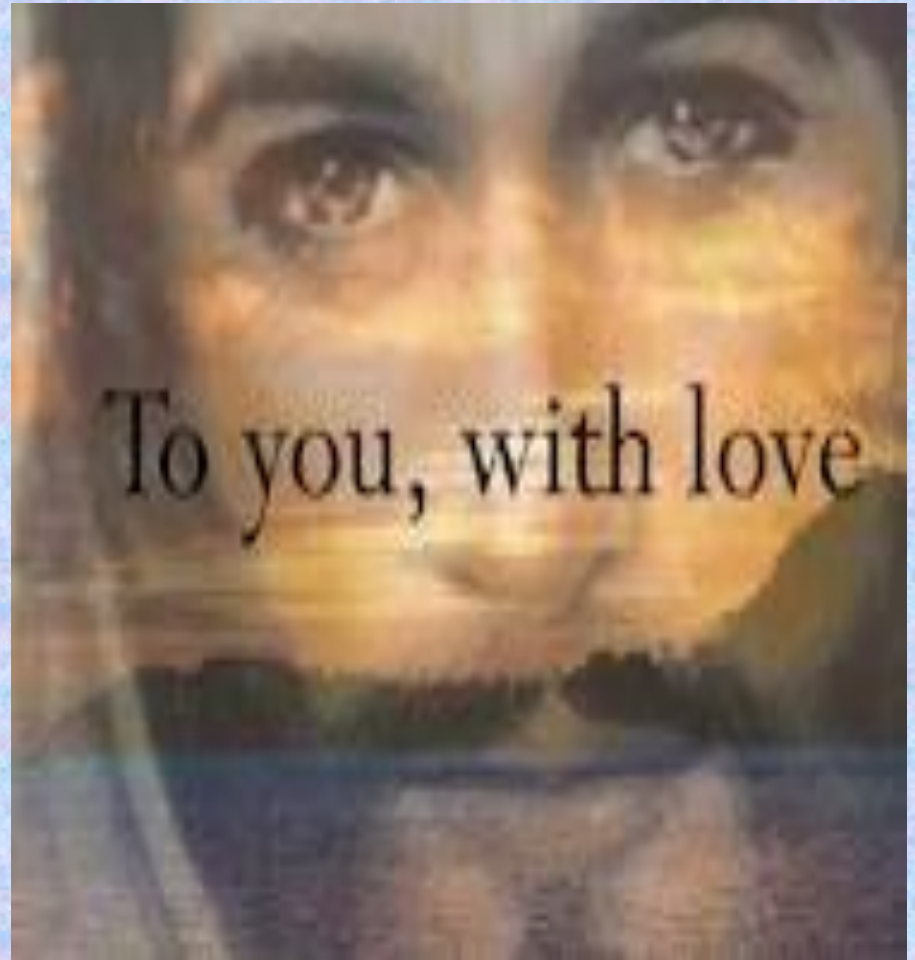
- Matthew chapters 5-7 is commonly called the Sermon on the Mount. The love of God is poured out on this mountain through His Truth. The truths that Jesus proclaimed on this mountain are still true today. Love is speaking the truth—in love.
 - ***Matthew 8:2-3 says “And behold, a leper came up to Him and prostrating himself, worshipped Him, saying, Lord, if You are willing, You are able to cleanse me by curing me. And He reached out His hand and touched him, saying, I AM willing; be cleansed by being cured. And instantly his leprosy was cured and cleansed.”***
- Jesus had just spent hours and hours pouring out of Himself truths to people on the mountain. They were thronging Him. A leper pushed his way through to Jesus for healing. Jesus patiently healed him. He wasn't too stressed out or too busy to take the time to love some who the world considered unlovable and totally untouchable.

Showing God's Love - Jesus

- Every day for 3 ½ years Jesus went about showing God's love. The gospel books tell story after story of His compassion and love for people.
- The greatest expression of God's love was Jesus willingly climbing on that Cross to be the once and for all sacrifice for you and me.
- If you want to learn how to love with the God love: study the life of Jesus. He is our example in all things God.

The Fruit of the Spirit

- “But the fruit of the Holy Spirit [the work which His presence within accomplishes] is love, joy (gladness), peace, patience (an even temper, forbearance), kindness, goodness (benevolence), faithfulness, gentleness, (meekness, humility), self-control (self-restraint, continence). Against such things there is no law [that can bring a charge]. (Galatians 5:22-23).
- Notice that the very first fruit is LOVE. This is the foundational fruit that all the other fruits build on.

The Fruit of Love

- Love is the very first fruit of the Spirit. This means that as we grow in the Lord and cultivate our relationship with Him, The Holy Spirit begins to cause us to bear fruit.
- Love is one of these fruits. All the fruits are invaluable assets to us and to God. But love is truly the foundational fruit. It must be evident in our lives if we are to bring others into the kingdom.
- Let's look at all the fruits...go to Galatians 5:22-23

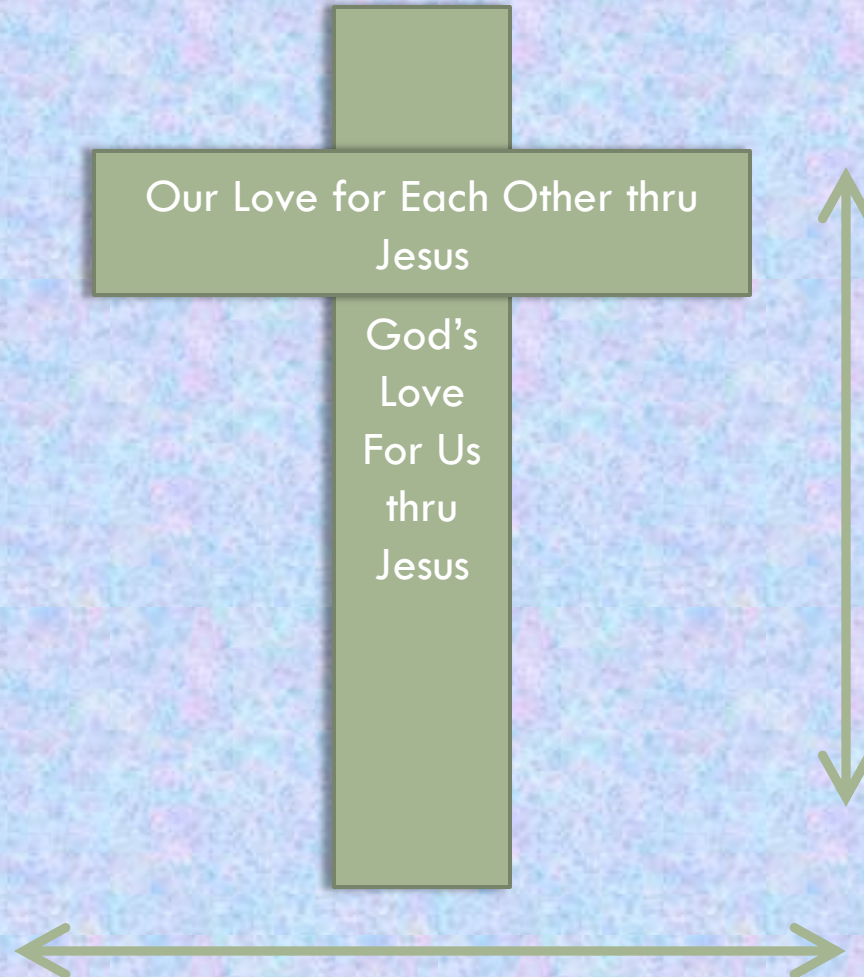
The Fruit of Love—Break it Down

- We see that love is the first fruit of the Spirit. Why did God choose to put Love first? Why not self control? Why not joy?
- Because love, in all its forms and components is the foundation of the Christian faith. It was for love that God created mankind in the first place. It was for love that God sent His Son Jesus to die in our stead.
- Let's look at the fruit of Love another way.

The Fruit of Love Take Aways

- The fruit of Love is the foundation for the rest of the fruits of the spirit.
- When we fully comprehend the importance of loving the way God does, we can begin to walk it out.
- Learning the Love Walk is a big step to maturity in Jesus Christ.

The Fruit of Joy

- If love is lacking in your life, you have no joy. Joy is the next step in the ladder to spiritual maturity. This is really the whole purpose of cultivating the fruits of the Spirit: spiritual maturity.
- Remember when you first fell in love? How you couldn't wipe the smile off your face? You were in love so you were full of JOY! Nothing could bring you down because you knew you were loved by someone and you loved someone.
- Joy is directly tied to love in the spirit realm too. It's the next step up.

JOY

The Fruit of Joy

- Joy is the second fruit of the Spirit listed in Galatians 5. What exactly does joy mean? It almost seems like a generic word somehow.
- Webster's dictionary defines Joy as "a feeling of great pleasure and happiness." This is all well and good but we know that feelings come and go. Joy is way more than an emotional event!
- A Definition of the Joy of the Lord:
 - ▣ **Joy** is a state of mind and an orientation of the heart. It is a settled state of contentment, confidence and hope.

The Fruit of Joy

- Joy is much more than a feeling. It is a state of mind. It is an attitude of the heart through the Holy Spirit.
 - ▣ ***The Bible says in Nehemiah 8:10 “Then Ezra told them, Go your way, eat the fat, drink the sweet drink, and send portions to him for whom nothing is prepared; for this day is holy to our Lord. And be not grieved and depressed, for the joy of the Lord is your strength and stronghold.”***
- Not only is joy a state of mind and an attitude of the heart, but the joy of the Lord is our strength and stronghold! We can rejoice in the face of the evil day. We can confidently “eat the fat and drink the sweet drink” because our God is on the Throne.

The Fruit of Joy Take Aways

- The fruit of joy is built upon love in the stairway to spiritual maturity.
- Joy is not an emotional feeling that comes and goes, rather it is a state of mind and an attitude of the heart.
- The joy of the Lord is the strong confidence that He has you. That security and sense of well-being brings the joy of the Lord.
- We can look evil in the eye and say Go! Because the joy of the Lord is our strength and stronghold.

The Fruit of Peace

- Peace is comfort. Peace is security. Peace is serenity. Peace is the third step in the stairway to spiritual maturity.
- Peace is a rare thing in this day and age; as is joy and love. But it should be found in abundance in the Church of Jesus Christ. The lost should be able to see that we have something they want.
- When there is love in your life, you are at peace with the world and with yourself. You feel comfortable and secure. Peace comes from a foundation of love.

PEACE

The Fruit of Peace

- What is evidence of peace in your life? Let's look at Jesus' idea of peace. Go to Matthew 8 verse 23:
 - ***“And after He got into the boat, His disciples followed Him. And suddenly, behold, there arose a violent storm on the sea, so that the boat was being covered up by the waves; but He was sleeping. And they went and awakened Him, saying, Lord, rescue and preserve us! We are perishing! And He said to them, Why are you timid and afraid, O you of little faith? Then He got up and rebuked the winds and the sea, and there was a great and wonderful calm (a perfect peace).”***
(Matthew 8:23-26)
- This was a pretty rough storm for Jesus to sleep right through it! But He was fully confident in His Father's plan for His life and He knew He had the authority to speak to those seas and winds...and He had enough calm to actually go to sleep.

The Fruit of Peace

- What storms are you going through? The fruit of peace, when fully cultivated will enable you to go through the storms of life with full assurance of victory because you know the Peacemaker...Jesus Christ.
- This peace can only be found in an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. Intimacy brings unity and unity always brings peace.
- We can rejoice because we are loved by the Creator of the Universe and He has given us His precious PEACE that is found nowhere else but in Him.

The Fruit of Patience

- Patience is a tough cookie without love as the foundation.
- Patience also means “an even temper” and “forbearance.”
- Even with love, the temptation to be impatient is great given the right circumstances.
- BUT it is possible that patience can be and should be part of our nature as a believer. That’s why it must be cultivated..and it’s a process.

PATIENCE

The Fruit of Patience

- The fruit of patience is the first fruit that really begins to show our spiritual maturity. Patience is the evidence that love is fully developed in us.
- Patience keeps us from becoming rude and unmannerly. It keeps us from saying hurtful things to those around us.
- The fruit of patience is a really “visible” fruit that other people notice. People seeing the fruit of patience, ponder on it..they think about it. It gives them pause and wonder about you. It piques their curiosity in some cases and can even open a door for witnessing.

The Fruit of Patience

- Patience isn't just about not getting mad at someone for taking too long in the grocery store or cutting you off in traffic.
- Patience is the ability to wait on the Lord without getting restless. It doesn't give room for doubt because patience is perfectly willing to wait on the Lord.
- The fruit of patience is a direct result of love being fully cultivated in you. In fact, you can't get patience until you get love fully developed in you.

The Fruit of Patience

- Let's look at Romans 2:3-5
 - ***“Through Him also we have access by faith into this grace in which we stand. And let us REJOICE and exult in our hope of experiencing and enjoying the glory of God. Moreover let us exult and triumph in our troubles and rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that pressure and affliction and hardship produce patient and unswerving endurance. And endurance develops maturity of character. And character produces joyful and confident hope of eternal salvation. Such hope never disappoints or deludes or shames us, for God’s love has been poured out in our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.”***

The Fruit of Patience

- Do you see how the fruits of the spirit are beginning to intertwine?
 - We rejoice in our troubles
 - Hardships we rejoice in produce patience
 - Patience and endurance produce a mature character
 - Maturity produces complete joy and confidence of who you are in Christ...the hope of glory!
 - The love of God is poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit.
- Love, joy, peace and patience...intertwined, becoming part of our very own character as we grow up in Jesus.

The Fruit of Kindness

- Have you ever noticed that it's easier to be kind to others when your life is secure or you feel your life is secure? Its when we are full of anger and fear that we lose patience with others and are rude, even hateful.
- Kindness can develop in us as we mature in love, joy, peace, and patience. When you are living in this kind of realm, kindness naturally follows.

KINDNESS

The Fruit of Kindness

- What is kindness? Kindness is when someone sees your smile, they see the smile in your eyes too. They see kindness.
- Kindness is so attractive! Kindness is love in action. For example, you are walking into the store and you see an elderly lady trying to put her groceries in the car. You ask her if you can help...and you do!
- Kindness is smiling warmly at the cashier with pain in her eyes. You never know what one act of kindness can do for a person who is at the end of their rope.

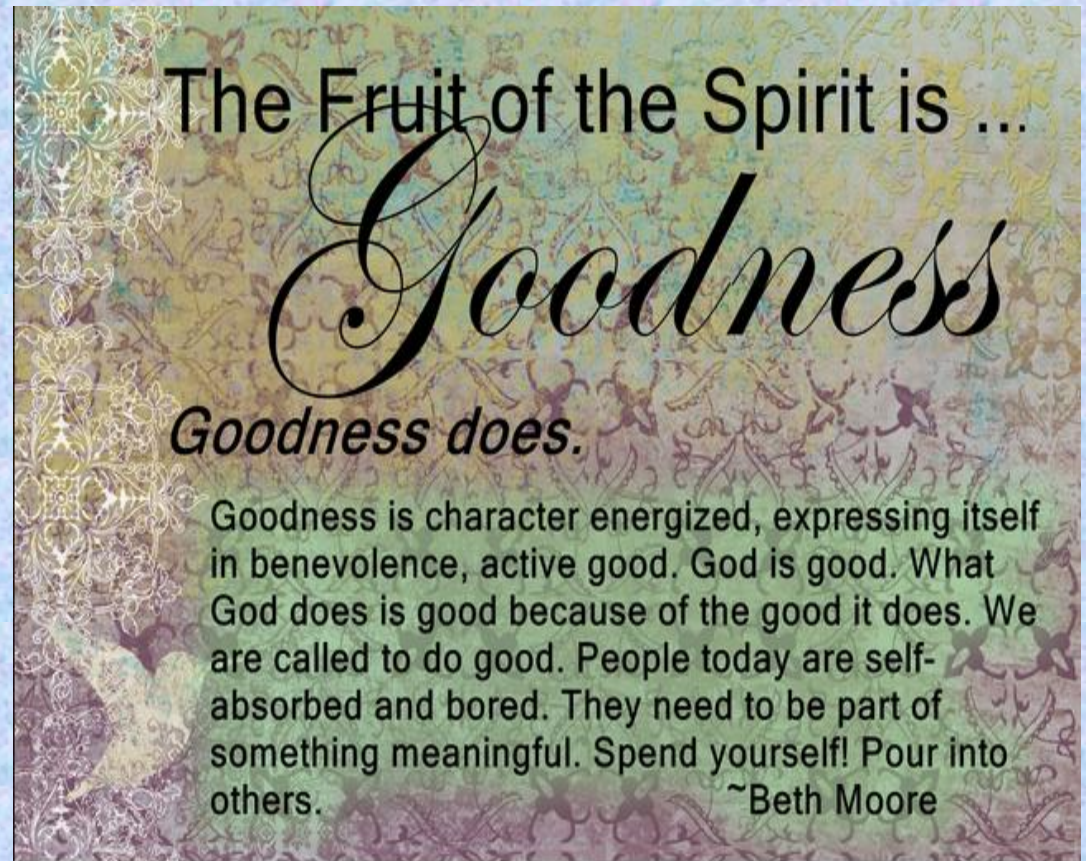
The Fruit of Goodness

- What constitutes goodness? We hear sayings like, “he’s a good man” or “she’s a good mother” but what makes someone good?
- Goodness is the demonstration of the qualities of God in a person’s life. A person who loves God and loves Jesus is a person who will exemplify the characteristics of God.
- Goodness is exhibited when the foundation of the fruits of the Spirit are in place in a person’s life. It’s a natural result.
- The Fruit of Goodness shows the world the character of God in YOU.

The Fruit of Faithfulness

- Faithfulness is the next progression up from goodness. When the fruit of goodness is developed, then faithfulness begins to be formed in us.
- What constitutes faithfulness? Faithfulness is what God is. It is being trustworthy, faithful and true. It is something people depend on.
- Have you ever worked with someone, who was faithful to be at work when they were supposed to, and did their job so well, that people relied on them a lot to do their job?
- That is being faithful. By exhibiting faithfulness, we are showing the world how God is. It's like goodness only it's more visible.

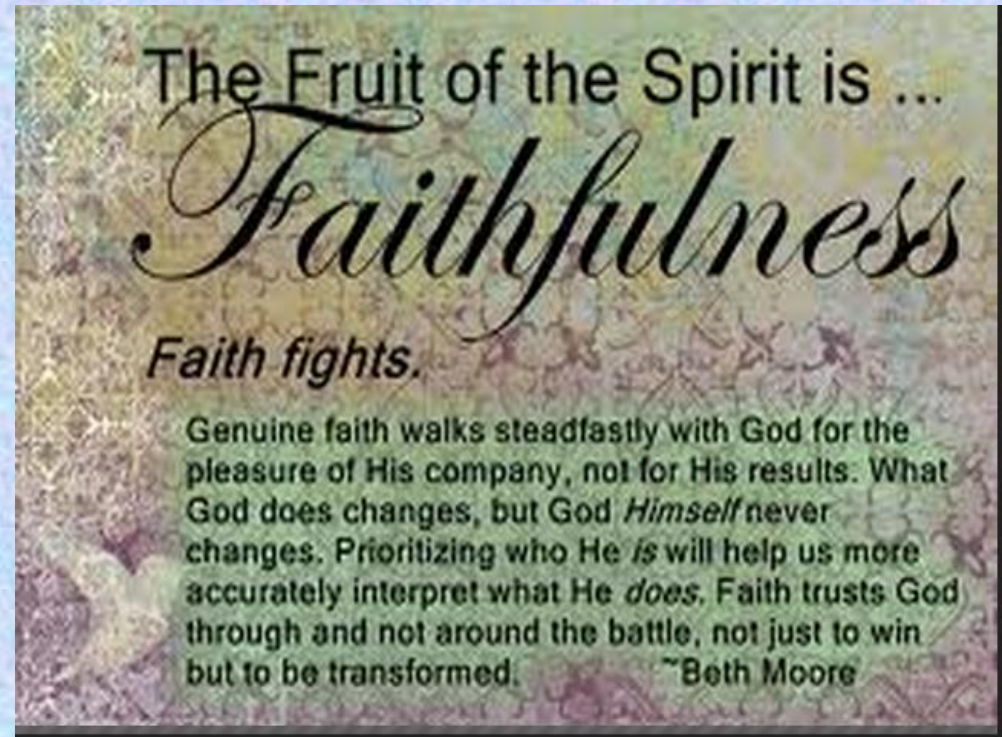
FAITHFULNESS

The Fruit of Faithfulness

- Faithfulness is seen day by day and moment by moment. It is what the lost see in us that draws them to the Lord.
- These days, faithfulness is a rare commodity. Commitment to everything is lacking in people today. When people find a faithful person, they are noticed and very much appreciated.
- When a person has this fruit of the Spirit cultivated, they become a valuable asset everywhere they go.

The Fruit of Gentleness

- The fruit of gentleness further shows the character of God in us. Gentleness is also humbleness. Pride has been defeated in a humble person.
- Gentleness exudes a quiet strength. A strength that is as tough as steel. People find comfort in the quiet strength of gentleness.
- Notice how the fruits are becoming more and more apparent to those around you as they are cultivated in your life?
- Remember the goal for all of us is: SOULS.

GENTLENESS

The Fruit of Gentleness

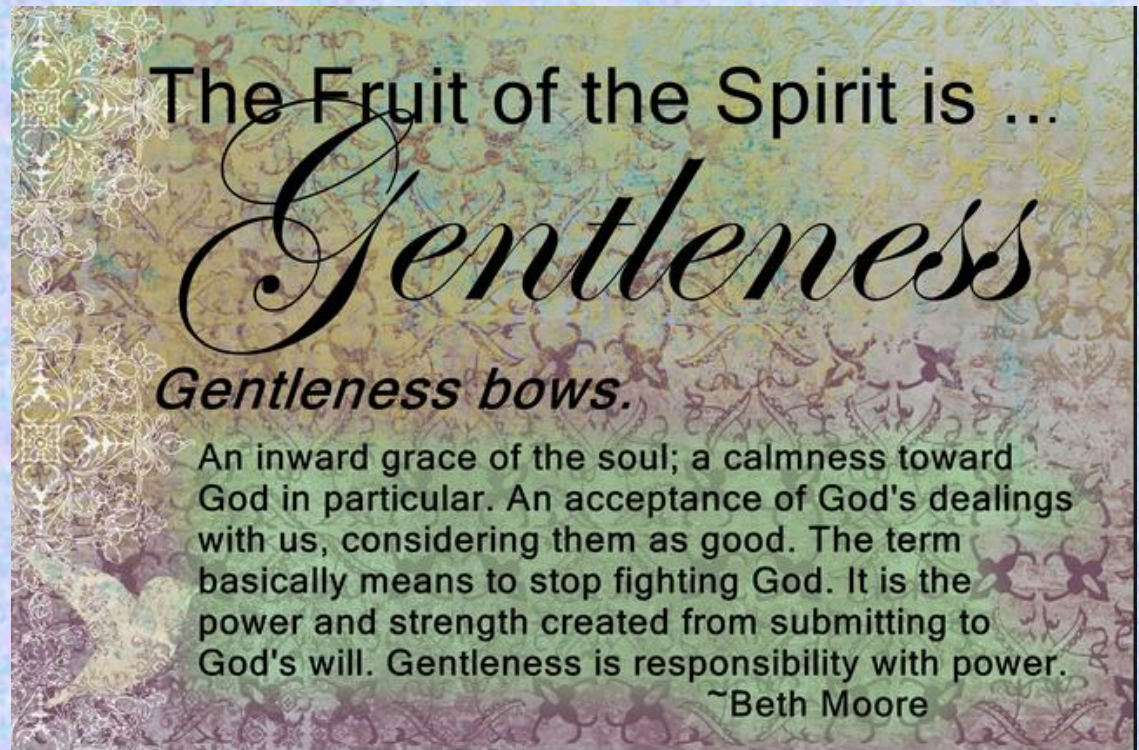
- Gentleness is also referred to as meekness. It is said that Moses was the meekest man on earth. Why? Because he walked with God, he had to be humble. When you sit up in a mountain for 40 days and nights with God getting revelation...you have to be humble!
- But meekness is NOT weakness. In fact Moses was so tough that the day he died, his eyes were not dim nor was his life force abated!
- Gentleness is the face of love to people. Something they can actually see in action.

The Fruit of Gentleness

- How is the fruit of gentleness cultivated in our lives?
When all the previous fruits are cultivated.
- We are almost at the top of the staircase of spiritual maturity!
- The fruit of gentleness is beautiful and delicious to those around you. People can sense the quiet strength of gentleness in you.

The Fruit of Self Control

- Here we are at the top of the staircase! Self-control! The fruit of self-control cannot be attained until all the other fruits are fully cultivated in you.
- What is self-control? Self-control is the ability through the Holy Spirit to put aside your own wants and needs and pursue instead those of the Lord.
- Jesus Christ is our example in this. He epitomizes the fullness of spiritual maturity. His self-control was astounding in what He had to endure for us.
- For the LOVE of us, He put aside His screaming flesh and endured the Cross.

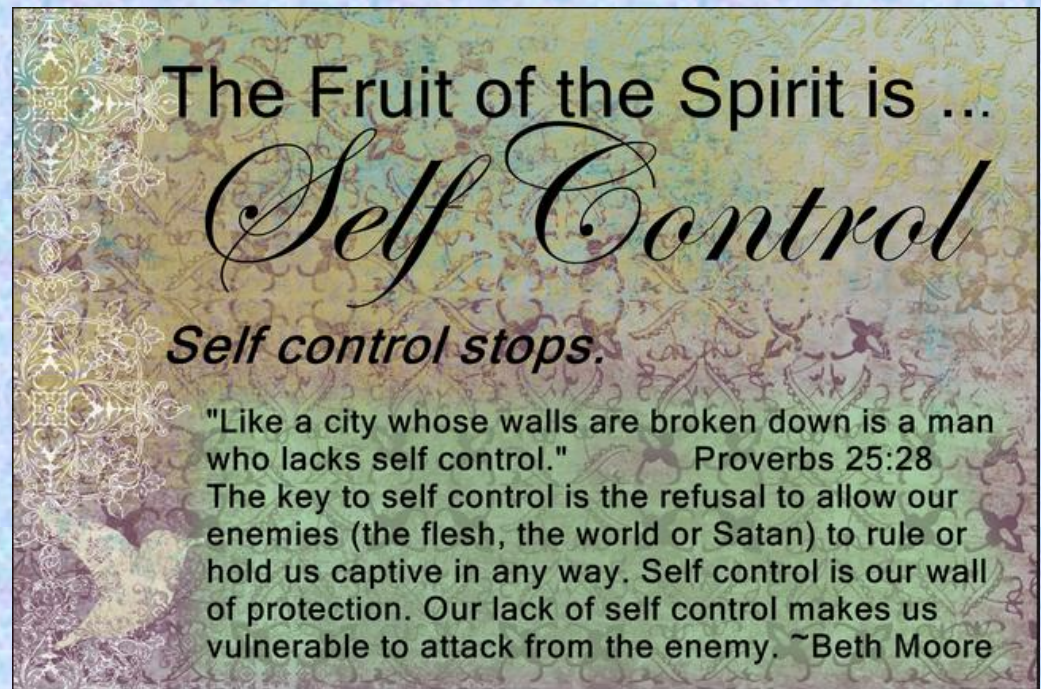
SELF-CONTROL

The Fruit of Self-Control

- Self-control is pretty much impossible when you are not mature in the Lord. It takes the steady, consistent cultivation of all the fruits of the Spirit to get to a point where you can control your appetites, emotions and temper.
- The fruit of self-control is the total submission of your desires and wants and even needs to that of God's. It is saying "I don't care how tired I am, God wants this person set free!"
- The fruit of self-control is having someone spit in your face and you can actually see them through God's eyes and not retaliate.
- The fruit of self-control is saying, I REALLY want to buy that dress, but I will give the money to the missionary who has nothing."

The Gift of Love

- The gift of love is the greatest of all the gifts. Only God can make love a gift and a fruit at the same time. Love is the greatest gift and the first fruit to cultivate.
- The Word says in I Corinthians 12:31 ***“But earnestly desire and zealously cultivate the greatest and best gifts and graces (the higher gifts and the choicest graces). And yet I will show you a still more excellent way [one that is better by far and the highest of them all—LOVE].”***
- The Apostle Paul is about to go into his discourse on LOVE in chapter 13. We are encouraged and told to seek the best gifts and graces with everything in us.
- And the highest and most precious of them all is LOVE...the God LOVE.

The Gift of Love

- What is the difference between cultivating the fruit of love and pursuing the gift of Love?
 - ***Romans 5:5 says “Such hope never disappoints or deludes or shames us, for God’s love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who have been given to us.”***
- Fruit has to have time to mature. It has to be tended to in order to bear fruit. A gift is given by the giver as an outside action.
- The fruit of love is becomes part of our innate nature through cultivation. The gift of love is given supernaturally by God for a specific reason and at a specific time.
- Keep in mind that the 9 gifts of the Spirit are to be used to edify the church.

Pursuing the Gift of Love

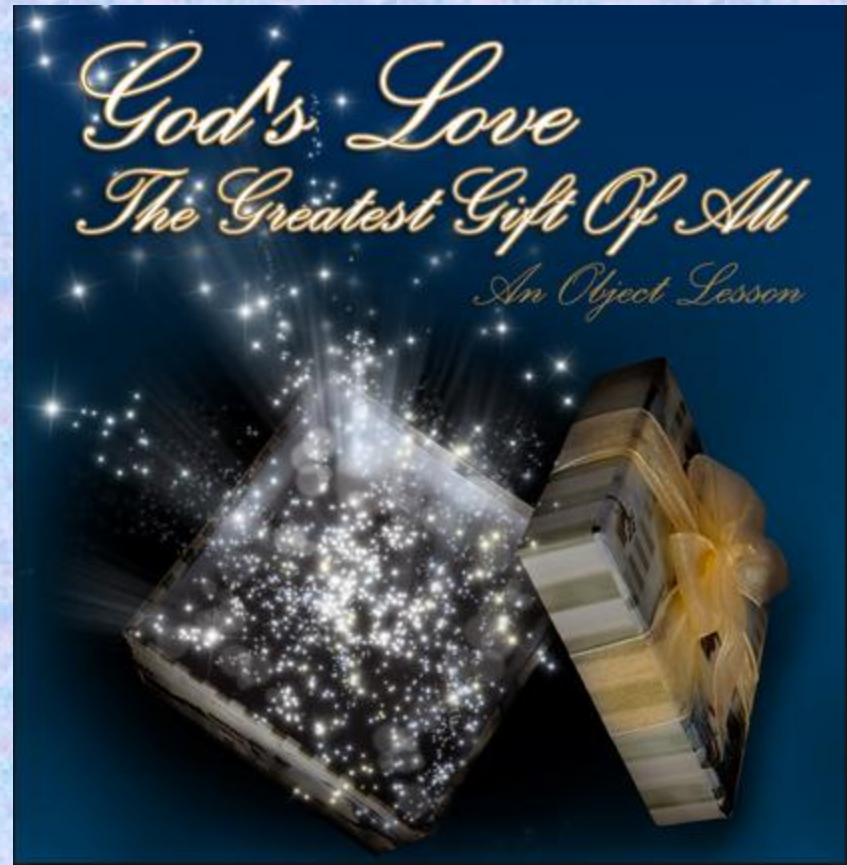
- Pursuing the gift of God's love---Agape—is simply asking Him to gift it to you as He wills.
- In fact, we should be asking Him to give us ALL the gifts. However, the Word clearly states in 1 Cor. 12:31 to pursue Love above all else. The greatest gift is Love.
- Before we enter our church services on Sunday morning, we should ask the Lord to give us first Love and the rest of the gifts to be used by Him to have His way in our services.
- Who knows but that God will send in a person who desperately needs to feel and experience the gift of God's Agape love through us?

Pursuing the Gift of Love

- I challenge you to start this Sunday. Before you walk in that door. During your morning prayer time: ask the Lord to give you the gifts of the Spirit; most especially love.
- I believe that when we start doing this, we will start seeing some amazing things!
- But stop at Sunday...begin asking Him every day to give you the gift of love and the other gifts! Who knows where He'll take you as He begins to use YOU to bring the lost to Him.

Cultivating the Fruit of Love

- Cultivating the fruits of the Spirit start with the acknowledgment that we need the Holy Spirit to help us in this process.
- Our lives are fallow ground when we come to Jesus. The ground is hard and unbroken. Ground like this can't be planted until it is broken up by a tiller.
- As we yield to the Holy Spirit in us, He will begin to break up that fallow ground with the Word of God and with our continual fellowship with Him.

Cultivating the Fruit of Love

- The beginning of our walk is the beginning of the cultivation process. Every day, we open the Bible and read out of it. Every day, we pick a time to spend with the Lord that is reserved only for him.
- Every day the Holy Spirit breaks up more fallow ground in our lives. After awhile the ground gets softer and the dirt looser and more pliable. Something can actually be planted in it!
- The seeds of love are planted, as love matures, joy is planted. The soil is continually worked in you by the Holy Spirit.

Cultivating the Fruit of Love

- Soon, joy is matured in you and the seeds of peace are planted. And on it goes until one day, you look in the mirror as a mature, Christ-like believer who has the same self-control and humility Jesus has!
- Cultivation is a process. Cultivation is getting into that intimate relationship with the Creator of the Universe and letting Christ be formed in you. Until one day your life really is hid with Christ in God. Nobody sees you anymore...they see Jesus.

Looking Through His Eyes

- The fruit of love cultivated in our lives gives us the maturity in Him to allow the gift of love to flow through us to the lost.
- There has to be a certain level of spiritual maturity to actually be able to be given the gift of love for a certain person and situation.
- Let's look at two scenarios to see the difference between a Christian with little spiritual maturity and one who is fully mature in dealing with love.

Looking Through His Eyes

- Mabel is back! Mabel is a Christian, but she has not allowed the Holy Spirit to cultivate the fruits of the Spirit in her life. Mabel works with an a woman named Agnes who is full of anger and hatred towards everyone. A real chip on her shoulder.
- Mabel comes to work after hearing a sermon on loving the lost and decides to show the love of God to Agnes. Mabel tells Agnes that Jesus loves her and has a wonderful plan for her life. Agnes responds by laughing sarcastically in her face and lets out a string of cuss words that would make a prisoner blush.

Looking Through His Eyes

- Mabel is unable to see Agnes through the eyes of Jesus because all she sees is the rejection and pain Agnes has caused her.
- She lashes out and tells Agnes she's going to burn in hell and storms off in a huff.
- Because Mabel has not let the Holy Spirit cultivate love in her along with the other fruits, she doesn't have the humility or self-control to withstand the rage of someone this angry.
- The Result? Agnes says to herself "typical fake Christian! God isn't real.."

Looking Through His Eyes

- Ethel also works with Agnes. Ethel has been in an intimate relationship with Jesus for some time. She has actively pursued the gifts of the Spirit and she has been allowing the Holy Spirit to cultivate the fruits of the Spirit in her life through her time spent with Him.
- Ethel is a mature believer. She is humble. When she looks at Agnes, she sees a woman torn apart by pain. The pain has festered into a great gall of bitterness.
- Ethel senses a prayer burden for Agnes from the Lord and begins to intercede every day for her.

Looking Through His Eyes

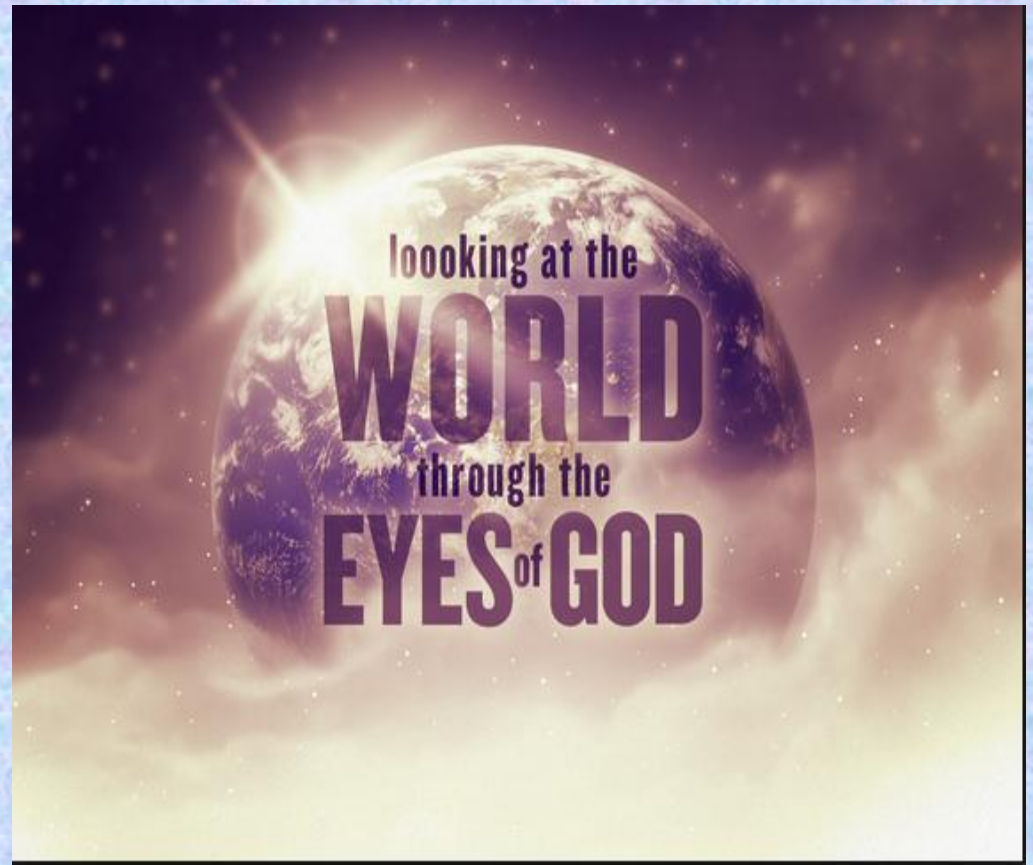
- Ethel passes by Agnes desk and says good morning to her like she does every day. Agnes glares at her as usual and grunts. The difference on this day is that Ethel has started praying for Agnes.
- As time passes, the Lord begins to soften Agnes' heart and when Ethel says "good morning", she returns it!
- Eventually Ethel is able through prayer and love to enter into a friendship with Agnes, which in turn leads to her salvation in Jesus Christ.

Looking Through His Eyes

- Can you see how much more God can use us when we allow the Holy Spirit to cultivate the fruits of the spirit in us?
- When the Father looks at a human being, no matter how filthy, how vile or how ugly, all He sees is a precious soul that His Son died for. A person who He planned for from eternity past. A person who has a purpose to fulfill in His overall plan.
- He has to have our cooperation to love these people into the kingdom of God!
- It's very important that we, as His people allow the Holy Spirit, that we pursue and actively ask for help in cultivating the fruits of the Spirit.
